
Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ!

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT APRIL 2023

The monthly meeting of the Church Council was held April 19, 2023. This report is submitted to communicate to our congregation the work of the Council. By way of background, the Council serves as the Administrative Board, Trustees, Finance and Staff Parish Relations Committees in a governance and oversight role over all ministries. Church Council meetings are open meetings except when the Council deals with Staff Parish Relations matters.

The following are the major items from the Council's agenda discussed at the April meeting:

- For our spiritual development we discussed chapter five in the book "Autopsy of a Deceased Church 12 Ways to Keep Yours Alive" by Thom Rainer. We will identify those ways to stay healthy and alive. The prayer commitment for Chapter Five, The Budget Move Inwardly, was the following: Lord, help me to grasp that all the money I think I have is really Yours. Help me to grasp that all the money our church has is not the church's but Yours. Give us healthy giving hearts to use these funds according to Your purpose. We encourage the congregation to also consider this prayer and the challenge it poses for us.
- Approved March Council meeting minutes
- Reviewed March Council newsletter report.
- As we do every meeting, we reviewed the monthly financial report and balance sheet. After three months of the year we are running a deficit of \$5,854.31. The deficit would be larger were it not for the fact we take income from our investment account.
- Approved a policy for members of the congregation to borrow church owned items and equipment.
- Received an update on maintenance team activities. Four quotes were received to replace the sanctuary roof. The company that replaced the roof in 1993 informs us the roof is still in reasonably good condition and replacement can wait. We will wait a few years, which will give us time to set funds aside. We will consider some type of fundraising campaign.
- We approved a policy on controlled access to the church campus for the safety and security of those who use the facility, particularly children and youth.
- Approved an investment management understanding for the Olivia Walden Scholarship with SOTA. The account is under the umbrella of the church's investment account but it is a SOTA account.
- Approved Annual Conference Offerings as follows: Building the Beloved Community Fund \$500,
 The Cup of Water Fund \$500, West End Christian Community Center \$1,000. Funds come from
 the Council Mission Fund to be used at the discretion of Council.
- Approved an updated Corporate Authorization Resolution for our investment account and as required by Woodlands Bank.
- Approved accepting two Greenlawn Cemetery Burial Plots from Robert Caldwell. We will not own them but will be able to offer them to a family. Mr. Caldwell no longer has a need for them and desires for them to be offered to a family in need.
- Reviewed first quarter endowment fund report. Our investments did fairly well in the first quarter of 2023.
- Learned SOTA is moving forward with the formation of a 501c3 corporation. We will soon prepare and review an agreement for SOTA to lease space in the building. We discussed building use fees for SOTA.

- We received and approved 2022 audit reports for SOTA, the church general account and the
 endowment account. Thanks to Tom Bixler and Jamie Aderhold for conducting the audits. The
 WECCC audit was just completed and Council will review that audit in May.
- We continue to explore options for a pianist and choir director. We are thankful for the music ministry gifts Ben Manetta, Irenay Weaver and Doreen Mileto have shared with the congregation.
- The Congregational Care Team is planning monthly fellowship activities for the congregation.
- Moving forward, we will continue the practice at the beginning of our meeting to provide time
 for any member of the congregation to address Council with any comments or concerns. Time
 will be limited to five minutes. This will permit input without the need to stay for our entire
 meeting.
