Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ!

This summer is just flying by! I pray you have been able to enjoy some outside time in between the heat, smoke, and rain. I am sure some of us are frustrated by all of that and that is why the congregational care team is working so hard to put together some upcoming events where we can get together as a family.

1 Corinthians 12:4-13 reminds us that we are in this life together and each of us have been given gifts to use for the betterment of the whole. Here is the reminder from Paul:

⁴Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit. ⁵ And there are varieties of ministries, and the same Lord. ⁶ There are varieties of effects, but the same God who works all things in all *persons*. ⁷ But to each one is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. ⁸ For to one is given the word of wisdom through the Spirit, and to another the word of knowledge according to the same Spirit; ⁹ to another faith by the same Spirit, and to another gifts of healing by the one Spirit, ¹⁰ and to another the effecting of miracles, and to another prophecy, and to another the distinguishing of spirits, to another *various* kinds of tongues, and to another the interpretation of tongues. ¹¹ But one and the same Spirit works all these things, distributing to each one individually just as He wills.

¹² For even as the body is one and *yet* has many members, and all the members of the body, though they are many, are one body, so also is Christ. ¹³ For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body, whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free, and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT JULY 2023

The monthly meeting of the Church Council was held July 26, 2023. This report is submitted to communicate to our congregation the work of the Council. By way of background, the Council serves as the Administrative Board, Trustees, Finance and Staff Parish Relations Committees in a governance and oversight role over all ministries. Church Council meetings are open meetings except when the Council deals with Staff Parish Relations matters.

The following are the major items from the Council's agenda discussed at the July meeting:

For our spiritual development we discussed chapter eight in the book "Autopsy of a Deceased Church – 12 Ways to Keep Yours Alive" by Thom Rainer. We will identify those ways to stay healthy and alive. The prayer commitment for Chapter Eight, Pastoral Tenure Decreases, was the following: God, please give our pastor a heart and a vision to reach and minister to people beyond our own walls. Teach me to be the kind of church member who encourages and supports our pastor, so discouragement and disillusionment does not lead to departure. We encourage the congregation to also consider this prayer and the challenge it poses for us.

- Approved June Council meeting minutes
- Reviewed June Council newsletter report.
- Received and approved the WECCC Audit.
- As we do every meeting, we reviewed the monthly financial report and balance sheet. After six months
 of the year we are running a deficit of \$13,980.25. The deficit would be larger were it not for the fact we
 take income from our investment account. We will continue to monitor this as it may impact ministries.
 We encourage the congregation to consider our response to the membership vow to support the ministries of the congregation through our prayers, presence, witness, service and gifts.
- We reviewed the Endowment Funds report for the end of the second quarter ending June 30. All accounts have increased in value and are now all above the original principal amount.
- We reviewed the facility use agreement with SOTA and set the utility fee for 2024.
- Heard from the maintenance team that our boilers, water heater and all HVAC units have been serviced.
 Numerous repairs were made to malfunctioning components. Costs will be taken from our buildings and grounds account. These systems are all over twenty years old and our costs for maintenance are increasing.
- Ellen Boll will start work in August as our pianist.
- We approved hiring a new sexton to replace Steve Martin who is retiring.
- We will conduct staff reviews in August.
- The Lay Leadership Team will meet in August to begin considering persons for open Council seats.
- We awarded the Barnhart Beard Scholarship to Janelle Moser. She is a Master of Divinity student at United Theological Seminary. She is part of the Luzerne UMC in Luzerne, PA.
- The Congregational Care Team continues to explore fellowship opportunities for the congregation.
- Approved a worship survey to be included in the bulletin for the first two weeks in August asking the congregation for their input on the one worship service on Sunday morning. We desire input if it should continue or if we should return to two services.
- Learned there will be a block party on either September 16 or 23 for the Newberry community. We approved using our west parking lot for the event.
- Moving forward, we will continue the practice at the beginning of our meeting to provide time for any
 member of the congregation to address Council with any comments or concerns. Time will be limited to
 five minutes. This will permit input without the need to stay for our entire meeting.

Operation Christmas Child Boxes

We will once again be packing Operation Christmas Child boxes. We have a few remaining items from last year but will need more in order to complete additional boxes. Also, the fund for the mailing of the boxes has been depleted so we are in need of people willing to donate money for shipping. The cost this year is \$10 again this year. Would you be so willing as to help with the \$10 cost? If so, please drop a check or cash in the offering plate or give to Annie and/or Bob Burns with the memo marked Operation Christmas Child.

Some information from the Samaritan's Purse website regarding boxes:

Start with a quality "wow" item such as a stuffed animal, soccer ball with pump, or clothing outfit that will capture the child's attention the instant he or she opens the box.

Add personal care items and school supplies. They vary slightly depending on the age and gender for which you are packing. These items include chalk (age 2-4), crayons, colored pencils, notebook, pencils, pencil sharpener, pens (age 5-9 and 10-14), a comb or brush, and a toothbrush.

Please refrain from these items: Vaseline®, scary items (things that will frighten a child rather than bring joy)' war-related items (such as toy soldiers, military vehicles, or wearable camouflage), liquid paint sets or liquid glue, rubber balls with liquid filling, liquid lip gloss, matches or fire starters, seeds, sand/rocks/shells gathered from nature, all types of food, candy, or gum, medications or vitamins, toothpaste, nail polish, money or play money, baby powder, baking soda, razors, liquids or lotions, breakable items or glass containers, aerosol cans, used clothing or toys

Further information will follow including the packing and due dates.
