

Each year the Lycoming County Brotherhood Alliance will seek to identify individuals for consideration by a selection committee. This group shall be comprised of all previous award winners, with the most recent recipient serving as chairperson.

- Is recognized as having demonstrated outstanding integrity in Lycoming County sports effectiveness through persistent hard work.
- Is recognized as having a commitment to the maintenance and continued development of sporting volunteers.
- Is recognized as a sports ambassador for all athletes in Lycoming County.

### CHURCH COUNCIL REPORT – FEBRUARY 2024

The monthly meeting of the Church Council was held February 21, 2024. This report is submitted to communicate to our congregation the work of the Council. The Council serves as the Administrative Board, Trustees, Finance and Staff Parish Relations Committees in a governance and oversight role over all ministries. Church Council meetings are open meetings except when the Council deals with Staff Parish Relations matters.

The following are the major items from the Council's agenda discussed at the February meeting:

- We are beginning a Leadership Development study. Renovate or Die by Bob Farr was distributed with instructions to read the Introduction for our March meeting.
- For Spiritual Development, Pastor Lori will be using the book <u>Prayer: The Timeless</u> <u>Secret of High-Impact Leaders</u> by Dave Early. The first chapter was highlighted, Value the Power of Prayer.
- Approved January Council meeting minutes.
- Reviewed January Council newsletter report.
- Financial information was reviewed. We are currently in the black thanks to contributions being gifted from RMD's. It was noted these are a one time contribution. The paper for our bulletins has significantly increased from our current vendor. Office Supply was found to have a much better price. The cost to sponsor a bulletin is \$25.00 per week.
- We have had 3 individuals visit us. One attends on a regular basis
- The Maintenance Team reported they are waiting on equipment for heat in the children's rooms. A circuit breaker that serves the roof top unit was replaced.
   There are numerous can lights not working. Our electrician suggested converting to LED lights to be more efficient and cost effective. Council approved having all can lights in our building replaced, starting with the main hallway by Fellowship Hall first.
- Gayle Page requested that a commercial carpet cleaner be either rented or purchased for her use. Council discussed the differences, but felt that purchasing was the better option. Purchase of a rug doctor, universal cleaning tool (for upholstery) and shampoo at a cost of approximately \$750.00 was approved.
- Safety and Security Team updated paperwork for emergency procedures, signed by Elaine Hinston and Pastor Lori.
- Council is looking into having our Web page updated. More to come at a later time.
- Finance Items Insurance premiums have significantly increased to \$760.00 for the parsonage and \$18,680.44 for the church campus. This does not include WECCC.

- Congregational Care Team discussed events though December. There is a bulletin board in the hallway by the office listing all upcoming dates with 'Save the Date' items listed for future events.
- Monthly Mission Projects are currently being voted on.
- Council Town Hall was discussed with the positive things happening being highlighted. Lynn Girardi will be addressing our congregation on Sunday, February 25 to discuss what Staggered Starters Class is doing.
- Saturday morning Lenten breakfast/devotions started February 17.
- Election of officers: Scott Hall accepted the position as Vice-Chair for 2024. Ann Allison accepted the position of Assistant Secretary.
- The auditor will be here on March 5.

Next meeting will be on March 20, 2024 @ 6:30 pm.

## A Word from the West End Christian Community Center

First I would like to thank all of you who helped to make 2024 a record year for the WECCC. Thanks to the volunteers, patrons and financial supporters, we were able to assist more people this past year than at any other time in the life of the WECCC. Your continued prayerful support in 2024 is vital as we charge into the new year.

Just as some examples here are just a handful of our 2023 statistics: SK Café served 18,647 meals, up 3,000 from 2022, the Shoe Express provided 410 pairs of sneakers and distributed through the FOCUSED program to the children in the Williamsport Area School District, we had over 3,200 people pass through our Welcome Wagon beverage area, the Community Cupboard emergency food pantry served over 1,400 people in need of food and lastly the Clothes Closet/Thrift Shop served 12,000 customers and their Christmas sale had a banner year.

These are just numbers on a page until you see the lives they represent. The people who pass through our doors, be they volunteers or patrons, are absolutely amazing with incredible stories. Stories that we are invited to be a part of.

We live by the scripture "They will know you are my disciples by the way that you love one another." This guides all that we do at the WECCC. Please stop by the office and allow me or other staff to show you around and possibly you might be called to join our team.
